# Key Terms


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10-20% F/R - This refers to other districts similar to us that also have between 10-20% of students eligible for free or reduced lunch. This is a measure of economic advantage/disadvantage.

DFG "I" - District Factor Groups (DFG) were developed in 1975 for the purpose of comparing student performance on statewide assessments across demographically similar school districts. They are based on census data. The last time DFGs were identified was in the year 2000. In the year 2000, Readington was a DFG "I". Other surrounding districts who were "I"s are: East Amwell, Clinton Township, Flemington-Raritan, and Branchburg. We maintain our status as "I" but this data could be outdated.


# ELA Achievement Comparison

# Summary

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Readington Township School District reported scores of 72% of students meeting/exceeding expectations in ELA and 58% of students meeting/exceeding expectations in Math.

These scores are well above state averages in both ELA and Math.

In ELA, Readington outperforms other districts of similar F/R lunch population, Hunterdon County, and DFG as well.

In Math, Readington outperforms other districts of similar F/R lunch population, Hunterdon County, and scored 2 points below the DFG.

The historical trends also demonstrate Readington's high achievement back to 2016-2017.
