If you have any questions during my presentation, please feel free to ask. I'll be happy to address any comments or concerns you may have as we go.


ADJUSTING TO THIRD GRADE

Ready Math


- Is a research-based program.
- Provides a balance of conceptual understanding, procedural fluency, and application.
- Develops a classroom environment that promotes mathematical reasoning and discourse.
- Promotes a gradual-release model that helps students build on previous knowledge, explore multiple approaches to solving problems, and strengthen critical thinking and reasoning skills.

New Concepts for Third Grade:

Multiplication, Division, Fractions, Quadrilaterals, data & graphs, area, perimeter, order of operations, mass, capacity, measuring to the nearest quarter inch, adding and subtracting with re and ungrouping, adding and subtracting across zeros and numbers greater than 1000, word problems (multi-step) & rounding.

i-Ready (Diagnostic Assessment and Instruction)



- The *i-Ready Diagnostic* is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit your child's needs. Each item a student sees is individualized based on their answer to the previous question. For example, a series of correct answers will result in slightly harder questions, while a series of incorrect answers will yield slightly easier questions. The purpose of this is not to give your child a score or grade, but instead to determine how best to support your child's learning.
- Diagnostics will be given in September, January, and June
- *i-Ready Instruction: i-Ready Instruction* provides students with lessons based on their individual skill level and needs, so your child can learn at a pace that is just right for them. These lessons are fun and interactive to keep your child engaged as they learn.

VALE Word Study

Vocabulary and Language Enhancement

Purpose: Transfer vocabulary, word study, and knowledge of affixes to independent reading and writing practice

Benefits: Rather than memorizing 10-20 words a week, learning word parts as well as Greek and Latin Roots will assist students in reading and understanding thousands of words independently across genres

Through VALE students analyze and spell multi-syllable words with the most common roots, prefixes, and suffixes. Additional spelling instruction will be addressed according to individual students needs through small group instruction and writing conferences.
