Eating a healthy snack during the school day increases children's attention and focus during the day.




The best fast food are fruits and vegetables. Also, each day your child will need a water bottle. Hydration helps to prevent sleepiness and fatigue as well.

What is speech?

Speech refers to how we say sounds and words, and involves the following:

- 1. Articulation: producing sounds using the mouth, lips, and tongue
- 2. Voice: how we use our vocal folds and breath to make sounds
- 3. Fluency: the rhythm of our speech



What is language?

Language refers to the words we use and how we share ideas including:

- 1. Form: the building blocks of language including grammar, word order within sentences, and phonological (sound) awareness
- 2. Content: vocabulary understanding and use
- 3. Use: social communication skills

Character Corner

Kindergartners will be learning how to be a trustworthy friend and student.

We will learn what it means to be honest, reliable, and dependable.



Spring is right around the corner and the kindergarten children's skills in literacy are in full bloom. Their confidence has developed and they are writing words and sentences in their daily writing. As the year continues, the students will fine tune their skills with spacing and using as many lowercase letters as they can as well as sight words.

Phonemic awareness skill development will continue to flourish with their newly learned skills in phonics. They are excitedly reading decodable books with short vowel blending of three letter words and the sight words that they are learning. In addition, students are beginning to blend two letters together such as "dr" or "sn" to figure out those tricky words like *drive* and *snowman*. Through our literature activities, the students will be working on reading comprehension, concepts of print, story sequencing, characters, and retelling. The children will continue to grow in literacy skill development over the next couple of months.

After completing our Wood and Paper unit in science, the students will begin to investigate with motion. They will learn about pushing, pulling, colliding, rolling and the concept of force. Then, we will progress to our science unit "Animals Two by Two" with a lot of interesting creatures facts entering our worlds!

Kindergarteners have been skip-counting by 2's, 5's and 10's, and creating number stories. The children will continue to review and build upon their understanding of addition and subtraction stories. Visualizing teen numbers as a ten and extra ones, and continuing sharing work for partners 2 thru 6 will be a focus for the boys and girls this month. Yes, we will be very busy little bees this spring!

Our First Graders will be discussing the importance of being trustworthy in school and at home.





In February, our first grade authors were writing so much as they continued to create Opinion Writing pieces. They authored collection writing, reviews, and persuasive letters. Now, in the month of March, our first grade writers will be tackling nonfiction writing. Students will think about a topic they know a lot about and create a chapter book.

What strong, voracious readers our first graders have become! Starting this month, our first grade readers will be introduced to nonfiction reading. Students will get to read a variety of books about things that really interest them.

They'll study author's craft; thinking about specific words or pictures the author chose to include. They will tell you all sorts of facts they learn about!

In math, we just completed Unit 2, and are now beginning Unit 3. In this unit, the students will be working on place value, counting to 120, money, and time to the hour and half hour. Please continue to read the family letters that are sent home on Mondays and have your child practice his/her skills using i-Ready.

We are now beginning our social studies unit called, "Our Changing World and the People In It". Students will learn that while people today are the very much the same as people who lived long ago, the way people live has changed over time.

We will talk about

Please help your child demonstrate trustworthiness this month and remind him or her to color in a bucket piece each time he or she shows trustworthiness.

This year, winter seems to be hanging on a little longer, but our second grade skills are getting so much stronger!

In Reader's Workshop, students will explore nonfiction books. We will study and identify different features that authors use to teach readers about various subjects. We also will discuss how our "reading voices" change while we read nonfiction books to sound more like teachers or reporters, instead of characters in fiction books. We will continue to strengthen our fluency skills and use our phonics strategies to help us decode longer and unfamiliar words as we read. Be prepared for your second grade reader to teach you about lots of different subjects in these next few weeks!

Our next Writer's Workshop unit will teach students how to write letters to friends about the books we read. Writers will learn how to express opinions about characters and plot lines, and also practice retelling and summarizing books within a friendly letter format. Additionally, we will learn how to write book recommendations so we can share our favorite stories with each other.

Mathematicians continue building and working with three-digit numbers in math class. In the next few weeks, we will be comparing and adding and subtracting them. Keep practicing math facts and strengthening automaticity with Reflex Math!

Scientists continue to investigate solids and liquids and we are doing a great job recording our data and practicing the scientific method. We are enjoying our discussions and experiments as we uncover a deeper understanding of the unique qualities of the different states of matter.

We are looking forward to watching the amazing growth that will sprout these next few months with your children!

March is trustworthiness month! We will be discussing the many ways students can be trustworthy at home and school. Please encourage your child to color in puzzle pieces for their trustworthy behavior choices!



Students and teachers have been enjoying this year's thematic unit as we celebrate the novel, *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. Classes have been reading the book and having fun as we imagine exploring the wonderful world of Wonka's Chocolate Factory. We are crafting related projects that complement our SEL and Literacy curricula. Third graders think that Roald Dahl deserves a golden ticket for his writing talent and extraordinary imagination!

Our third grade writers are becoming more confident in their ability to persuade others as they discuss a topic of their choosing. As they write, students are learning to utilize persuasive language as well as to incorporate facts and details that properly support their arguments. Teachers continue to focus on the importance of revision as a critical stage in the writing process. This helps students make decisions about organization and word choice. With each unit of study, our writers are developing their ability to edit their own work by adding punctuation or fixing spelling errors that they identify independently.

Our current themes in reading revolve around character studies and mystery stories. Students will be using their detective skills as they learn to read for clues! Additionally, they will continue to notice and think about characters as they look closely for habits, strengths and suspicious behaviors. As they reflect on their reading, students continue to practice locating and providing evidence from the text in both written and oral responses. They are also learning to infer meanings of unfamiliar words by using clues in the text and prior-knowledge.

In math classes, students worked with multiplication and division facts and applied problem solving strategies. They practiced other applications of multiplication, such as finding the area of shapes. Next, the **whole** third grade is excited to begin learning all the interesting **parts** about our unit on **fractions**. The teachers are **equally** enthused! Remember to encourage practice of all math skills at home using the websites, iReady and Reflex Math!


