As we integrate our monthly character traits into instruction, we try to focus on five major areas of Social-Emotional Learning or SEL. The five Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) Competencies include: Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness, Relationship Skills, and Responsible Decision-Making (CASEL, 2017).

One place that students see us putting it all together is in the WHS SEL Lounge. This is a place that Mr. Anthony Tumolo first envisioned for us four years ago. Mr. Tumolo is a former WHS teacher, who now works as a district Supervisor as he shares his SEL expertise with all of the schools.
