Minutes

- 1. Accelerate Learning After School Program Update
 - a. After school math grades 2-8, 2 days/week for small group instruction; 30% acceptance rate
 - b. LA grades 6-8 (2 groups, 1 teacher); 40% acceptance rate. 6th grade attendance is consistent, 7th and 8th is inconsistent
 - c. January will begin virtual tutoring for registered students using Litera Program; 70% acceptance rate (likely higher acceptance rate due to the ability to schedule at the parents' and students' convenience)
- 2. G&T Screener and Process Revisions Update
 - a. Grades 1-3 will be an in-class Performance Task where the GT teacher conducts a lesson and eligible students can be identified
 - b. Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test 3 (NNAT3) for grades 2 and 5 beginning September 2022 to replace OLSAT
- 3. SEL Updates
 - a. CAP 2022-2023 Plan (Grades 3, 5, 7); Christine Crielly will serve as liaison
 - i. Ensuring we prevent redundancy of material presented grade over grade
 - b. Aevidum Pilot (note: Aevidum is supplemental to our existing mental health unit)
 - i. Aevidum Update at RMS
 - 1. Standard mental health unit beginning the week of 11/29/21
 - 2. Aevidum curriculum pilot lessons will begin the week of 12/6/21
 - ii. Little Aevidum Update
 - 1. Plan is to pilot in January and February in the K-5 buildings.
- 4. Digital Star: Sustainable Jersey
 - a. Vision is complete and will be uploaded to website

b. Committee is working through the 8 action items required on the application. This application goes along with Sustainable Jersey.

5. Pride Survey for RMS

- a. Prevention Resources of Hunterdon County currently surveys high school students every 2 years and would like to expand the survey to 6th through 8th grade students
- b. Survey questions are anonymous and relate to drugs/alcohol/peer use; information would be available to our school counselors
