## **Minutes**

1. District Logo Project

- a. All 12 participants will be recognized at June 8 BOE meeting
- b. Committee selected top 4 to be distributed to community for a vote
- 2. Summer Teacher Academy
  - a. Good selection of workshops and participation
- 3. Summer Accelerate Learning Final Numbers
  - a. ELA 84 attending, 184 invited
  - b. Math 40 attending, 105 invited
    - i. If additional students decide to attend, there is a little extra room available before more staff would be needed
    - ii. Funded using ESSER II We are able to use ESSER III to continue program in summer of 2022 if needed
- 4. ESSER III/ARP Allocation and Safe Start Plan
  - a. Allocation \$370,044
  - b. Committee reviewed draft Safe Start Plan which will be made available to the Public in accordance with American Rescue Plan (ARP) guidelines
- 5. SEL/Mental Health
  - a. Hunterdon Behavioral Health and MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) Handbook Draft
    - i. Can be extended up to 3 years using ESSER funding
  - b. Aevidum Curriculum Pilot in grade 8
    - i. One week unit on mental health and suicide prevention during Health class with counselor and teacher
    - ii. Little Aevidium pilot in grades 2 and 5 depending on success with Grade 8
      - 1. Age appropriate mental health curriculum, such as identifying feelings
  - c. Equity Update
    - i. Workshop over the summer with leadership team and one teacher leader per school
    - ii. Leadership team will gauge workshop on how it will translate to our district and how to move forward
- 6. Life Skills Field Trips for ESY
  - a. Grocery shopping, recreation all using skills that are a basis of the curriculum

## 7. Curriculum Summer Projects

- a. All interdisciplinary connections have to be updated with the new standards for Career Ready Life Skills, Computer Science Education, Social Studies, Health/PE, Visual and Performing Arts, World Language, and Science.
- b. New standards by content area: Social Studies, Health/PE, Visual and Performing Arts, World Language, Science (Science is done).
- c. Financial Literacy needs to be added to second grade.
