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AN ACT concerning State school aid and supplementing Title 18A 1 2 of the New Jersey Statutes. 3 WHEREAS, Paragraph 1 of Article III states, "The powers of the 4 5 government shall be divided among three distinct branches, the 6 legislative, executive, and judicial. No person or persons belonging 7 to or constituting one branch shall exercise any of the powers 8 properly belonging to either of the others, except as expressly provided in this Constitution;" and 9 WHEREAS, Paragraph 1 of Section IV of Article VIII states, "The 10 Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a 11 thorough and efficient system of free public schools for the 12 13 instruction of all the children in the State between the ages of five 14 and eighteen years;" and 15 WHEREAS, Paragraph 2 of Section IV of Article VIII states, "The fund for the support of free public schools...shall be annually 16 17 appropriated to the support of free public schools, and for the equal 18 benefit of all the people of the State;" and WHEREAS, Paragraph 7 of Section I of Article VIII states that the 19 income tax is to be, "...annually appropriated...exclusively for the 20 purpose of reducing or offsetting property taxes;" now, therefore, 21 22 23 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 24 of New Jersey: 25 26 provisions of P.L.2007, c.260 1. Notwithstanding the (C.18A:7F-43 et al.) or any other law to the contrary, State school 27 28 aid for the first school year beginning after the effective date of 29 P.L., c. (C.) (pending before the Legislature as this bill) and for 30 each subsequent school year shall be provided to school districts as 31 follows: 32 a. The Department of Education shall determine each public school district's projected resident enrollment for the budget year 33 34 and the total Statewide public school resident enrollment. 35 The State Treasurer shall determine the total projected b. 36 revenue from the State income tax for the budget year. State aid for each school district for the budget year shall be 37 c. determined pursuant to the following formula: 38 TDSA = (TITR/TSE) * TDE39 where 40 41 TDSA is School District State Aid; 42 TITR is Total Projected Income Tax Revenue; TSE is Total Projected Resident Enrollment; and 43 44 TDE is District Projected Resident Enrollment. 45 46 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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STATEMENT

Whereas, paragraph 1 of Article III states, "The powers of the government shall be divided among three distinct branches, the legislative, executive, and judicial. No person or persons belonging to or constituting one branch shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others, except as expressly provided in this Constitution."

9 Whereas, paragraph 1 of Section IV of Article VIII states, "The 10 Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a 11 thorough and efficient system of free public schools for the instruction 12 of all the children in the State between the ages of five and eighteen 13 years."

Whereas, paragraph 2 of Section IV of Article VIII states, "The fund for the support of free public schools...shall be annually appropriated to the support of free public schools, and for the equal benefit of all the people of the State."

18 Whereas, paragraph 7 of Section I of Article VIII states that the
19 income tax is to be, "...annually appropriated...exclusively for the
20 purpose of reducing or offsetting property taxes."

21 This bill establishes a new formula for the allocation of State aid 22 to school districts to satisfy the Legislature's constitutional 23 responsibility to provide for a system of free public schools. The 24 bill provides State aid by determining a per pupil amount of State 25 aid and multiplying that amount by the school district's projected 26 resident enrollment for the budget year. The per pupil State aid 27 amount is determined after the State Treasurer projects the total 28 revenue amount from the State income tax for the budget year. 29 Following the determination of the projected total State income tax, 30 the Department of Education is to divide that amount by the total 31 projected resident enrollment of the school districts. The 32 department determines each school district's State aid by multiplying this per pupil State aid amount by the district's 33 34 projected resident enrollment.

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
